#### FOGERLUND, ZALTASH AND HEINRICH LEAD PARADE OF WINNERS IN VEGAS

**R**ay Fogerlund and Abbas Zaltash are the victors of the First World-Wide Twin Championships tournament. The event, staged by the Nevada Backgammon Association, drew just over 200 players to the beautiful Treasure Island Hotel in Las Vegas. Attendance was down from previous Nevada winter events due to its preholiday scheduling.

Fogerlund, a 37 year-old fireman from Taft, CA defeated Dallas hotel developer Harvey Huie in an exciting 15–12 Nevada State finals. Fogerlund, whose only previous major victory was at the 1992 San Diego Gran Prix, paced himself to a 9-5 lead over Huie. But one doubled gammon later, Harvey had tied the score at 9-all.

At 11-all, Harvey turned another game around to gain a 12-11 edge. "Is your name Huie, or Houdini?" Ray asked as he left for his third break within six games.


Upon returning, Fogerlund was able to win the next four points and the 5-figure prize money, but not before making one particularly controversial pick-and-pass play that he described as "A classic choke." [See Dec. 1993 *Flint Area BackgammoNews* for Ray's first-person account.] Still, it was a weekend of great play for the new Nevada State Champ who also reached the finals in Hyper-Gammon and the \$1000 Limited Jackpot.

**PITTSBURGH'S** Abbas Zaltash chalked up another title defeating Texan Tom Wheeler

in the International Cup. Zaltash prevailed over 28 8-player knockout qualifiers in the high-entry Blitz-type format.

It was a QUICK 2-hour Masters Invitational finals between 1990 World Champion Hal Heinrich (Canada) and author/analyst Kit Woolsey (CA). The 23-point finals ended following an aggressive cube by Heinrich in the following position:

Following double/take, Hal rolled 6-5 (21/10), Kit danced, Hal rolled 6-6 and went on to win a gammon.

In the postmortem, Hal thought the double was correct. Given the match score, Kit disagreed. Hal did admit that, "When the cube comes back to me on 8, it's nasty."

But that double aside, match commentator Malcolm Davis rated winner Heinrich's checker play as "... a work of art."  $\Delta$

#### KAZAROSS DEC. RALLY WINS CBPC POINT RACE

A strong December boosted Neil Kazaross ahead of Gary Kay to earn him 1993 Chicago Bar Point Club Player of the Year honors. Neil started fast in January, collecting 7.68 master points. It looked like smooth sailing for the San Diego transplant until he hit rough waters mid-year. Between 14 June and 11 Oct., Neil managed only 2.80 points.

During that period, defending BPC champion Gary Kay returned to the top spot. Going into December, Kay's lead was 24.28–22.64. But a repeat victory was not in the dice. Kay had his worst month of the year while Kazaross was earning 5.12 points, including a lock-up victory 21 Dec.

Asked what was involved in winning the CBPC title, Neil commented, "You have to keep playing tough, even when things aren't going well. I thought about giving up during my summer cold-spell. I couldn't win a match. But you have to weather it. You have to play it out.

"This is harder than winning a major weekend event for two reasons. First, you have to show up almost every week. Second, you have to force yourself to always play tough for 12 months. The Bar Point Club certainly has many top players and without a doubt the most depth of any tournament club in the country."

Awards Night (on 11 Jan. at the Golden Flame) will honor Neil Kazaross, Gary Kay, John Demian, Jake Jacobs and the rest of the Top-20 finishers.




Terry Kuchenbrod in the 1992 Midwest Championships semifinals.

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### SHADES OF GRAY RULINGS CONTEST WINNERS by Danny Kleinman

The co-winners of last month's Rulings Contest are Ed Maslansky (Silver Spring, MD) and Jeremy Bagai (Philadelphia, PA) who will split the \$50 cash prize. Both Ed and Jeremy had four answers in agreement with Danny Kleinman.

For the record, entrants had the the greatest difference of opinion with Danny's rulings on #2 and #6. The Chicago Bar Point Club only differs with Danny on #3, preferring (A).—Ed.

1. (B) Tough luck, Vanna. You can't pass by saying "Take": no matter what you claim to "mean" by that. The rules specify that you must say "Pass" or other words to the same effect. If you'd said "Drop," for example, or "I'll give you a point," you would be deemed to have passed. Instead you chose the one word which most clearly designates a *take*. Never mind that your position "was" a pass, or that 90% of all other backgammon players would think it so. We've all seen (and made) bad takes. I rule that you just did so. Of course, Clint was entitled to act on that basis, so his good roll stands. Next time, abide by the rules.

2. (C) Carl, you bought 100% of Bob's action and sold none. You never even approached Bob to offer him a share. If

Bob had won the tournament, you'd have been entitled to a large prize. You're entitled to nothing now. Alan, you lucked out. In effect, you made a private bet with Bob, booking against him. You "sold him short," as anyone who dealt in stock market shares would say. You get to keep the \$200 he wagered. But had he won, you'd be liable for half the amount of the prize accruing to Bob's "owner" in the Calcutta.

3. (C) Frank, you are entitled to a 2-in-30 chance of drawing a buy. To give you this chance, I'll draw once from 15 random names including yours. If your name is drawn, you get a bye. Ed and Dave, you were awarded byes in a random drawing where each of you had a 2-in-29 chance. But you were entitled only to a 2-in-30 chance. You should each therefore receive a 29-in-30 chance of keeping your bye. So if Frank draws his bye, a 1-in-15 chance, I'll draw between you to see which of you keeps the second bye. This gives each of you a 1-in-30 chance of losing his bye (the 1-in-15 chance that Frank draws a bye, multiplied by the 1-in-2 chance that the other draws the second bye) and thus a 29in-30 chance of retaining it.

4. (D) Whoa, Jim! What business have you touching any die on the playing surface until both have landed? You've broken the rules. Who knows whether the die still spinning might have toppled over, struck the other die, and changed its setting from a 6 to some other number? There are several ways to interpret your roll:

- (c) You must reroll the die you lifted prematurely and play the new number plus a 2

I won't choose among these interpretations. Instead, because you committed the infraction, I'll offer the choice to Sally.

5. (D) However, I'll give 1/2 credit for (B). What sort of sportsmanship is this from the namesake of one of our most distinguished Supreme Court justices, Hugo? Who cares whether one size is "standard" or not? Use the dice Betty can see most clearly. If you insist on "rolling for choice of dice," as the rules permit, of course, I'll allow it. But if you use the smaller dice, then in any dispute as to what the roll was after either of you has completed a turn, I will presume Betty's account to be correct.

6. (B) Dick, you confused poor Jane by putting your cup and dice on the board while she was distracted looking at the score. If you objected to her using your dice, you should have stopped her before she rolled. But why should you object to this anyway if all dice were equally fair and random? You don't get a free shot. Jane, play your double-6s.  $\Delta$

#### **1994 HOOSIER TOURNEY UPDATE**

Scheduling Hoosier Backgammon Club tournaments for 1994 took a lot of thought. Our decisions were partially based on the repeated comments we've heard, i.e.

"There are too many tournaments," and "The Hoosier Club is not large enough to justify having two major events each year." We appreciate these comments and also understand some player disappointment that there will be no National Labor Day Tournament in 1994.

In past even-numbered years, World Cup tournaments have been scheduled in early August, most recently in Dallas. This year, Kent Goulding had a scheduling problem during that period due to World Cup Soccer in Dallas. Kent worked with us, exploring the possibility of beginning World Cup IV on Labor Day. We agreed with him that having NLD on top of WC IV might cause some players to choose between events, possibly hurting the attendance of both. Kent has assured us that staging World Cup Backgammon over Labor Day is a one-time occurrence which means that the annual NLD tournament will return to Indy in 1995.

The Indiana Open was squeezed out of the 1994 Spring schedule by the Midwest Championships, Easter and the Tournament of the Américas in Costa Rica. With the information we had at the time, we chose to schedule the 42nd Indiana Open July 29–31 at the Radisson Hotel.

Hopefully, with the decisions we have made, no one will feel that there is a need to fill the weekend void prior World Cup IV which starts on Labor Day Monday. Bill Robertie and Kent Goulding have some great things planned for WC IV including the addition of an Advanced division. Hope to see you in Indianapolis and Dallas.— Butch and Mary Ann Meese, HBC Directors, Indianapolis, IN





#### PROBLEM #200 SOLVED by Kit Woolsey

Match to 9 points. Black leads White, 4



**B** lack has rolled a great number—one which at first glance looks like it plays automatically. There are two things Black wants to do: cover the blot on the 4-point and get his back men moving. The 3-3 roll allows him to do both with 24/21, 13/4. But what about defense? Should Black instead concentrate more on something like 24/ 18(2) or 24/21(3), 13/10?

Making the 4-point is *huge*. It builds the fifth part of a full prime, makes the next inner board point, and covers a blot that Black dearly wants to protect. In addition, since Black is short on builders for the 4point, locking it up now is even more important. Yes, Black will need a lot of justification to make any play other than 24/21, 13/4.

How important is it to build an advanced anchor here? It's certainly nice, but it's not vital. Black's back checkers are not fully blocked. White's bar point is open, and she's not favored to close it soon. This means that Black is in no great danger of losing a priming battle and going broke. After 24/21, 13/4 he will have two additional checkers on the midpoint to play with, as well as the checker he brings to the 21-point. This should give him all the time he needs to eventually extricate the other back men.

In addition, the suggested play starts to make an advanced anchor. Now that Black has made his own 4-point, White hits loose on her 4-point at her own risk. More reason to play 24/21, 13/4.

If White owned the bar point, then there might be a good case for getting everybody off the 24-point. If Black didn't take this opportunity to get them out now, he might not have a second chance. In the actual position, with the enemy bar point open, moving from the 24-point is not critical. "Offense before defense when possible" is a sound backgammon theme, as is accomplishing the goal which is most difficult to accomplish and most important to do quickly. 24/21, 13/4 follows all these principles.  $\Delta$


