A Prime Source of Backgammon Information

"All Animals Are Equal, But Some Animals Are More Equal Than Others"


Most players know the "average" backgammon roll is valued at 8 1/6 (add up all the rolls and divide by 36), but like George Orwell's "more equal" pigs in the book Animal Farm, some rolls are "more average" than others.

The most obvious deviation from the average is the first roll of each game. Since doubles are not permitted on the opening roll, the average first roll is exactly 7. The last roll of a game deviates from the theoretical average of 8 1/6 because of positions such as the ones in columns 2 and 3.

The average pip count for the last roll of the game in **Position 1** is 9.14.


(1/6)(14) + (5/6)(8 1/6) = 9.14

The average pip count for the last roll of the game in Position 2 is 8.35. If White



The average pip count for the last roll of the game in Position 3 is 7.36. Black must roll a double now or the game is over. (5/6)(7) + (1/6)[(1/6)(14) + (5/6)(8 1/6)] = 7.36

Some positions generate "last rolls" that are higher than the average and some that are lower. But I would conjecture that all the last rolls taken together do not average exactly 8 1/6.—Duane Jensen Δ
