## Bar Point Backgammon Study Yields Surprising Results

Many of you do not know that I was a sociology major. In an effort to gain more information on the sociological affects of playing backgammon, I used the Chicago Bar Point Club members, who meet once a week, to conduct a series of surveys. Here are the very interesting results.

The first week, I asked the players if they felt better physically as a result of playing backgammon. 12% said yes; 42% said they felt worse. 48% gave me funny looks or refused to answer the question.

The next week I asked if they felt better emotionally as a result of playing backgammon. 24% said yes. 35% said they felt worse. 17% told me to mind my own business. The rest refused to answer.

The next week I asked players if they slept better or saw any improvement in their eating habits since playing tournament backgammon. 8% said yes. 38% said no. 4% threatened me physically if I continued to ask them questions. The balance

refused to answer the question, and some wouldn't even listen to the question.

The next week I asked the players if they made new friends from backgammon. 3% said yes. 12% said no. 9% said no, but they've made some wonderful enemies. And the rest would not respond, except for one person who's comments I am not able to put in print and who I do plan to sue for his unprovoked physical aggression.

While it is difficult to draw sweeping conclusions from my study, I was able to discern some "trends" that offer interesting insights into the backgammon community, and I had some real quality time to think about it while I was recovering:

- Backgammon players are not really that tolerant when you ask them simple questions unless the questions are directly related to a checker play or doubling position.
- 2. Its easier to get a straight answer from a hyperactive 2-year old with a speech impediment during a hurricane than from a typical backgammon player.
- 3. Surgical removal of a doubling cube is not fun.—*Phil Simborg*  $\Delta$
